

# Falls Park Trails Description



## Blue Loop

The Blue Loop is the longest loop of the four, and it offers a sampling of most of the park's trail system. The biggest feature of the Blue Loop is its close proximity to the Sports Complex. Many of this loop's trails are actually part of other loops as well. North of the ball fields this loop utilizes a trail that passes underneath the railroad tracks. **THIS TRAIL MAY BE WET!** The Blue Loop also passes the North 40 Barn, the cemetery, the Town Court, the Military Memorial, Pendleton Historical Museum, and the Community Building.

## Yellow Loop

The Yellow Loop passes mostly through wooded areas. This loop is a great choice for nature lovers, as one could easily observe deer, raccoons, squirrels, chipmunks, and birds along its path. The northeastern segment of this loop is prone to flooding as it runs parallel to Prairie Creek, so it may be muddy or submerged. The North 40 Barn is located at the northern end of this loop. It then continues south along Pendleton Avenue and passes the cemetery, the Town Court, and the veterinary hospital. Just north of the Gazebo, the loop turns left and passes the Military Memorial, the Pendleton Historical Museum, and the Community Building before arriving back at the starting point. Use caution when using this trail as it crosses Pendleton Avenue in two locations.

## Red Loop

The Red Loop is located in the southwest corner of the Falls Park Trail System. It passes the Community Building and also provides access to the cemetery. Much of this trail is within the wooded section of the trail network, with a segment of the Red Loop connecting to the Pendleton Avenue sidewalk. Other sites along the Red Loop include the Pendleton Historical Museum and the Military Memorial.

## Green Loop

The Green Loop's path is mostly composed of sidewalks and paved trails, making it the perfect choice for anyone who doesn't want to take the chance of getting muddy. This route takes walkers around the southern areas of the park, and passes Brown Pool, the Community Building, the Conservation Building, and several historic homes on Water Street. The Pendleton Community Library is also located within close proximity to the Green Loop. The northern segment of the loop runs parallel to Fall Creek and passes behind the old baseball diamonds in Falls Park. The Green Loop requires walkers to cross the street at two different places, so use caution when using this trail.
