

The Pendleton Board of Directors for the Department of Storm Water Management met on February 6, 2019 at 6:00pm at the Pendleton Town Hall, 100 W State Street, Pendleton, Indiana.

The meeting was called to order and roll call taken. In attendance were Kyle Eichhorn, Shane Davis and Jerry Kelly. A quorum was established with three of three members present.

Representing the Town were Town Manager Tim McClintick, Town Attorney Alex Intermill and Planning Clerk Kate Edwards.

Also in attendance was Phil Tooley of 220 W High St Pendleton.

### **OLD BUSINESS – Update**

McClintick reported that February 27<sup>th</sup> we will meet again with the Drainage Board. Jeff Barger and a Bose McKinney representative will try to get final approval to get those drains turned over to us that are entirely within the Town limits.

We have had investigative work done on the North Broadway storm drain. The problem is between State Street and Water Street on the north half of N Broadway. There is a pipe with a loose joint that is half overlapped and a couple other places where it is broken down.

Once problem is eliminated we will try to drain Water Street back to the Broadway drain. Right now Water Street is a 6" pipe and bellied down and it is not large enough to handle the flow.

Eichhorn asked if the Town would get the money from the drains. McClintick said the Town would, even though it is not much money. Intermill advised that the funds will stay with each designated drain.

Davis asked if any notice has gone out about the utilities. McClintick advised that everything needs to be finalized before doing so, adding that the Ordinance has been passed along with a minimum fee, but the Town hasn't enacted collecting it.

Phil Tooley addressed the Board reporting that the drain where his sump pump goes out into the street and into a swell is 1.5" below the corner where the closest drain is. He presented a picture to the Board. He added that he felt the problem was aggravated by Fall Creek Regional Waste drainage work. McClintick shared his understanding of one reason for Fall Creek Regional's recent work was because there was ground water getting into their lines and, perhaps, since the lines were replaced, the ground water doesn't have that escape.

McClintick told Tooley he would meet up with him at the property at some point. Tooley said he would appreciate it.

Kelly advised Mr. Tooley that Fall Creek Regional Waste Board meets February 21<sup>st</sup> at 7pm. Tooley said that Tim McCurdy of FCRW already plans to come to the property because he recently discovered FCRW buried the drain to his garage drain.

The next meeting is scheduled for March 6, 2019 at 6pm.

Meeting adjourned at 6:14pm.
