Resolution R22-01 –Electing the Standard Allowance for Expenditures of the ARP Funds

The Resolution will allow more flexibility in spending the ARP funds. Expenditures placed in front of the council this month were security measures for the water plants, maintenance barn, town hall and the 5 water wells. Also included was the storm drains for Franklin Street. Total expenditures is approximated \$284,000. This would leave a balance in the fund around \$69,000.00

Carol Hanna asked if any extra money could be used for trails or sidewalks. Reske answered that some new trails and sidewalks were in with some of the new projects that are 2-3 years out.

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Shane Davis asked if an additional police car would be a qualified expenditure.

Motion to approve Resolution R22-01 was made by Robert Jones and 2nd by Marissa Skaggs. Motion approved 5-0.

Ordinance 22-03 Park Bond

Aaron Burris introduced the Ordinance. At the time of the presentation, the town's video system was not operating correctly. Since the Ordinance was introduced, it will remain on schedule for the mid-March deadline. It will come back before the council at the March 10th meeting.
